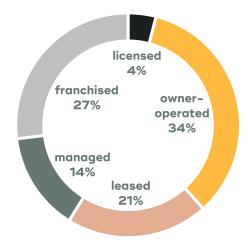

key takeaways

- In the Benelux, secondary cities generally outperformed capital cities in occupancy and ADR for the past 12 months
- According to STR data, Europe showed a strong ADR recovery in Q3 2021, attaining 91% of 2019 levels in September. In the Benelux subregion, weekday and weekend ADR had a similar pattern, with Antwerp leading, Rotterdam showing growth and Amsterdam lagging behind other cities.
- Based on the projection from STR, domestic leisure is expected to recover by 2022, international leisure by 2023 and domestic business by 2024. International business recovery will lag behind. 68% of attendees agreed that the leisure segment will perform best in the next 12-18 months.
- According to the attendees participating in our Menti survey, it is expected that in the next 3 to 5 years the top 3 best opportunities for growth in Benelux will be aparthotels &serviced apartments (30%), co-living & student housing (19%) as well as resorts (19%)
- Furthermore, 54% of attendees believe that the market will recover to 2019 levels in 2024, 31% in 2025 and 15% by mid 2022
